1971–1984 Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn, N.Y. Anti-Air Piracy; Original Special Operations Group (SOG) Member serving at Wounded Knee, S.D.; retaking of Tocks Island in the Delaware Water Gap; integration/insurrection at S. Boston High School.

Chief, Domestic Operations-Enforcement Division

1984-1986 U.S. Marshals Headquarters, Washington, D.C. Created the 15-Most Wanted Program which featured fugitives on the longest-running program in the FOX TV Network's history (24 seasons) hosted by John Walsh. Commanded Fugitive Investigative Strike Teams (FIST) III & IV operations which combined the investigative resources of federal, state and local law enforcement in New York City to take hundreds and thousands of federal fugitives into custody.

Deputy Chief of Enforcement

1986-1990

Responsible for overseeing the agency's National Fugitive Program.

Special Projects-Public Affairs

1990-1996

Responsible for overseeing Marshals Service support of The Warner Brothers 1993 film "The Fugitive" that starred Harrison Ford and Tommy Lee Jones. The Fugitive was the #1 film in the USA for 6-weeks in 1993. Served as agency advisor for the television show "The Marshal."

1996-1997

Responsible for overseeing International Fugitive Programs.

Chief International Investigations Branch

1997-2000

Responsible for performing undercover operations resulting in Federal convictions. Also served as Acting Chief Deputy U.S. Marshal, Eastern District of Virginia.
